Maria Croyle, RPh, PhD, is the Glaxo Wellcome Endowed Professor of Pharmaceutics at The University of Texas at Austin. She received her BS in pharmacy from the University of Pittsburgh and her PhD in pharmaceutics from the University of Michigan. She completed an NRSA post-doctoral fellowship in gene therapy at the University of Pennsylvania. Croyle’s research focuses on the use of viruses for immunization and medicinal purposes. Her work was featured in a 2015 episode of National Geographic’s Breakthrough Series titled “Fighting Pandemics.” Croyle received the Senate of College Councils Professor of the Year award honoring the “real world situations” she creates for pharmacy students while teaching the course “Physical and Chemical Principles of Drugs.”
