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PHARMACY RESIDENCY

PGY1 pharmacy residency programs build upon the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes, to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists. After completion of the PGY1 program, residents should be able to exceed in medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, and will also be eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy training.

The UH Meds Community-Based PGY1 Residency provides residents with a unique primary care setting. Residents will be integrated into the Advanced Primary Care (APC) clinics across the UH system. As a key member of the APC team the resident will provide hands on and virtual care for patients with a variety of chronic and acute disease states. Ambulatory pharmacy services continue to expand across the UH system allowing the UH Meds

Community-Based residents will have the opportunity to be practice innovators. Residents play a pivotal role in the creation and implementation of expanded services that provide quality and compassionate patient care. This program will prepare residents to create comprehensive patient care plans for both routine and complex patients, be practice innovators to expand access to services for their patients, and provide education to patients and caregivers they will serve. Upon completion of the residency program, the resident will be well qualified to practice as a clinical pharmacist in a variety of community or ambulatory care settings or continue training in a PGY2 program.
