PGY1 / PGY2 Health-System Pharmacy Administration and Leadership



Purpose

PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in specialized areas of practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care or other advanced practice settings. Residents

who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency are prepared for advanced patient care, academic, or other specialized positions, along with board certification.

Goals

- Facilitate the growth of a pharmacy learner in patient care opportunities as they prepare to be a leader in pharmacy and health system administration.
- Develop pharmacy leaders with the ability to orchestrate patient and population care in a health system.
- Foster pharmacy leaders with an innovative and forward-thinking mindset, geared towards advancing how pharmacy contributes to managing a patient's total health.
- Create opportunities for future pharmacy leaders to disrupt the current pharmacy care model and envision new models of pharmacy care to advance the profession.
- Involve future pharmacy leaders in interdisciplinary administrative models geared towards easier access for patients to care and expanding the resources they have available to them.

Residency program activities

- The PGY1/PGY2 resident's first year will be hosted as part of the existing PGY1 Pharmacy Residency program at Geisinger Medical Center.
 - Core rotations will be modeled using the required rotations as part of the partner PGY1 pharmacy residency.
 - Elective rotations will be tailored to give the resident early exposure to administration and leadership in the health system.
- As part of the PGY2 year, residents will gain leadership experience in the acute care setting, ambulatory setting, and with Geisinger Health Plan.
- Residents will collaborate with Geisinger's Administrative Fellowship Program, led by system executives in the Medicine Institute and Steele Center for Innovation.
- In the PGY2 year, residents will have the opportunity to extend rotations to concentrate in different areas of administrative practice.
- During the PGY2 residency year, the resident will serve as Chief Resident for all pharmacy residents in the Geisinger system.
